All training courses are designed to reach enthusiastic learners from all walks of life, including those in remote areas.

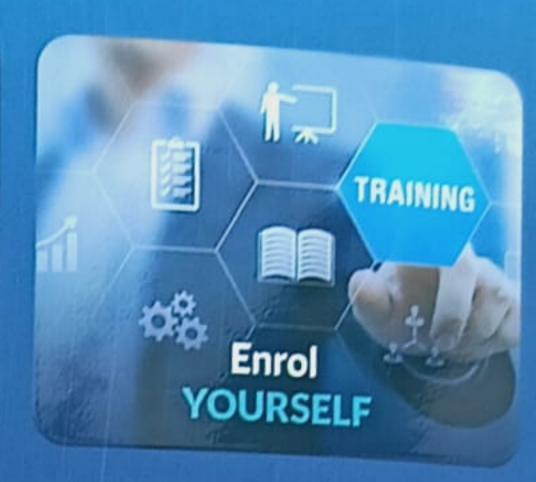
